Introduction
<p>Reading and writing are closely related to each other. Reading, particularly novel reading can enhance students' language proficiency and awareness by imitating and better emulating in their own writings word and idiom usages, sentence structures, sentence patterns, overall organization and rhetoric art as well, gleaned from the works assigned to them.</p> <p>In addition to the language acquisition the content of the works can help enrich students' life experience and cultural knowledge, sharpen their intelligence, nourish their imagination, and expand their vision, which in turn will assist in lending depth and breadth to their own writings.</p> <p>Three short stories and one novel of retold version, sampled with some selected original texts, will be chosen for perusal. Students will be asked to examine closely the language and content of the works assigned. Three short papers (2-3pages) for the three short stories each will be requested, and are equivalent to the mid-term examination. A longer paper(6-8 pages) of critical nature, based on the novel included in the syllabus, is equivalent to the final examination. You may summarize and interpret subjectively what you have read for your short papers, but for your longer paper you should follow MLA rules, and 4C's, clarity, coherence, cohesion, and concision. Teaching plan may be asked to be included in your papers.</p>
